

Tren penggunaan metode penelitian pendidikan pada Jurnal Internasional

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Abstract

The use of methods and origins of researchers in international journals is very diverse. Both journals published in the western and eastern parts of the world. This research aims to examine trends in the use of methods and researchers' origins in international journals through the Education Resources Information Center (ERIC) media as the search center. In ERIC, there are two journals studied by researchers, namely the European Journal of Educational Research (EU-JER) which has 30 journals and the Turkish Online Journal (TOJ) which has 29 journals. To study it, researchers used Content Analysis. Content Analysis is a scientific analysis of the message content of a communication. Technically, the scope of content analysis includes; classification of signs used in communication, using criteria as a basis for classification, and using certain analytical techniques as a prediction maker. There are three conditions in content analysis, namely; objectivity, systematic approach, and generalization. The research results show that the trend in using research methods in the European Journal of Educational Research (EU-JER) is 50% using qualitative methods. Meanwhile, in TOJ, the trend in using research methods is the opposite of EU-JER, namely 48% quantitative. Meanwhile, 100% of the researchers at EU-JET come from Indonesia. Meanwhile, in TOJ the authors are a mixture of domestic and foreign writers. Domestically 69% and overseas 31%.

Abstrak

Penggunaan metode penelitian pendidikan serta peneliti pada jurnal internasional sangatlah beragam. Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengkaji tren penggunaan metode dan asal peneliti pada jurnal internasional melalui media Education Resources Information Center (ERIC) sebagai pusat pencarinya. Di dalam ERIC tersebut, terdapat dua jurnal yang dikaji oleh peneliti, yaitu European Journal of Educational Research (EU-JER) yang terdapat 30 jurnal dan Turkish Online Journal (TOJ) terdapat 29 jurnal. Untuk mengkajinya, peneliti menggunakan Content Analysis. Content Analysis merupakan analisis ilmiah tentang isi pesan suatu komunikasi. Secara teknis, substansi content analysis ruang lingkupnya mencakup; klasifikasi tanda-tanda yang digunakan dalam komunikasi, menggunakan kriteria sebagai dasar klasifikasi, dan menggunakan teknik analisis tertentu sebagai pembuat prediksi. Ada tiga syarat dalam content analysis, yaitu; obyektivitas, pendekatan sistematis, dan generalisasi. Hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa trend penggunaan metode penelitian pada European Journal of Educational Research (EU-JER) 50% menggunakan metode kualitatif. Sedangkan pada TOJ, trend penggunaan metode penelitian kebalikan dari EU-JER, yaitu 48% kuantitatif. Sementara asal peneliti pada EU-JET 100% penulisnya berasal dari Indonesia. Sedangkan pada TOJ penulisnya campuran dalam negeri dan luar negeri. Dalam negeri 69% dan luar negeri 31%.

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Pendahuluan

Pendidikan adalah salah satu aspek mendasar dalam pembangunan masyarakat dan kemajuan manusia. Dalam upaya untuk memahami, meningkatkan, dan mengembangkan sistem pendidikan, para peneliti di seluruh dunia telah berkontribusi dengan penelitian yang beragam. Metode penelitian yang digunakan dalam penelitian pendidikan adalah kunci untuk memahami berbagai aspek dari pendidikan, mulai dari strategi pengajaran hingga evaluasi hasil belajar. Kecenderungan dalam pemakaian metode penelitian dalam penelitian pendidikan menjadi subjek perhatian yang semakin meningkat di kalangan ilmuwan pendidikan. Para peneliti pendidikan terus mengkaji dan memilih berbagai metode penelitian yang sesuai dengan tujuan penelitian mereka dan menggabungkan inovasi dalam metode penelitian dengan pemahaman mendalam tentang fenomena pendidikan yang kompleks. Oleh karena itu, kajian tentang kecenderungan pemakaian metode penelitian dalam penelitian pendidikan di jurnal internasional memiliki nilai yang signifikan dalam mengidentifikasi perkembangan dan evolusi dalam bidang ini.

Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengkaji dan menganalisis kecenderungan pemakaian metode penelitian dalam penelitian pendidikan yang diterbitkan dalam jurnal internasional. Dengan memahami tren ini, kita dapat memperoleh wawasan yang lebih baik tentang bagaimana penelitian pendidikan terus berkembang dan bagaimana pendekatan metodologis berkontribusi pada pemahaman kita tentang isu-isu pendidikan yang kompleks. Penelitian ini akan melibatkan analisis berbagai artikel penelitian yang telah diterbitkan dalam jurnal internasional dalam beberapa tahun terakhir. Dalam prosesnya, kita akan mengevaluasi metode penelitian yang digunakan, tren yang muncul, serta potensi pengaruh kebijakan pendidikan terhadap pemilihan metode penelitian. Diharapkan bahwa temuan dari penelitian ini akan memberikan kontribusi pada pemahaman yang lebih baik tentang evolusi dalam penelitian pendidikan dan pengaruh metode penelitian terhadap perkembangan pendidikan.

Penelitian pendidikan yang sudah dipublish, *Pertama*; Lisya Fiani Amalia dan Anggraeni (2021: 55) menjelaskan bahwa penelitian mahasiswa banyak menggunakan metode kualitatif. Faktor yang mahasiswa yang mendorong menggunakan metode tersebut, di antaranya; mahasiswa sebelumnya, dosen pembimbing, buku panduan, dan teman sejawat. *Kedua*, Nur Fajriani (2021: 31) penelitian di masa pandemi banyak menggunakan penelitian kualitatif dengan desain; studi kasus, kualitatif deskriptif, dan studi fenomenologi. *Ketiga*, Ripka Margaretha Ponggele dan Dety Mulyanti (2023: 251) mengatakan penelitian pendidikan yang terdapat pada jurnal nasional lebih banyak menggunakan kuantitatif. *Keempat*; Maria Mintowati (2020: 1) menjelaskan bahwa penelitian pendidikan pada mahasiswa program studi mandarin di kampus UNNES banyak menggunakan penelitian kualitatif-deskriptif.

Berdasarkan hasil penelitian terdahulu di atas, penelitian yang terkait dengan metode penelitian pendidikan pada jurnal internasional, masih terbilang jarang dan susah ditemukan. Oleh karena itu, penelitian kecenderungan pemakaian metode penelitian pendidikan pada jurnal internasional penting untuk dilakukan, karena dapat berguna untuk pemetaan metode dan tema-tema yang sering muncul pada jurnal internasional Eropa dan Turki. Dengan memahami kecenderungan ini, kita dapat memastikan bahwa penelitian pendidikan tetap relevan, efektif, dan responsif terhadap perubahan dalam masyarakat dan kebijakan pendidikan. Selanjutnya, penelitian ini juga dapat memberikan panduan bagi para peneliti pendidikan yang ingin memilih metode penelitian yang paling sesuai dengan tujuan penelitian mereka.

Metode

Penelitian ini merupakan penelitian deskriptif kualitatif, karena hasil yang akan didapatkan pada penelitian adalah berupa kata-kata yang merupakan hasil dari analisis pada jurnal internasional. Data primer pada penelitian jurnal internasional ini diambil dari *Education Resources Information Center* (ERIC) sebagai pintu awal untuk mencari jurnal internasional. Di dalam ERIC itu terdapat berbagai jurnal internasional. Dari berbagai jurnal internasional yang terdapat pada ERIC, ada dua nama jurnal yang dijadikan sumber primer oleh peneliti, yaitu; *European Journal of Educational*

Research (EU-JER) dan *Turkish Online Journal* (TOJ). Ketika peneliti mencari jurnal lewat pintu ERIC dengan kata kunci "Islamic Education in Indonesia", peneliti menemukan pada *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER) sebanyak 30 jurnal. Sedangkan pada *Turkish Online Journal* (TOJ) peneliti menemukan 29 jurnal internasional. Untuk mengkaji jurnal yang terdapat pada EU-JER dan TOJ peneliti menggunakan Content Analysis. Menurut Noeng Muhamad Content Analysis merupakan analisis ilmiah tentang isi pesan suatu komunikasi. Secara teknis, substansi content analysis ruang lingkupnya mencakup; klasifikasi tanda-tanda yang digunakan dalam komunikasi, menggunakan kriteria sebagai dasar klasifikasi, dan menggunakan teknik analisis tertentu sebagai pembuat prediksi. Ada tiga syarat dalam *content analysis*, yaitu; obyektivitas, pendekatan sistematis, dan generalisasi (Muhamad, 2000: 68). Untuk lebih jelas, di bawah ini data primer disajikan dalam bentuk tabel.

Hasil dan Pembahasan

Hasil

Pemakaian metode pendidikan pada jurnal-jurnal internasional, cukup variatif. Secara umum kecenderungan pemakaian metode penelitian lebih mengarah kepada penelitian kuantitatif dan kualitatif. Kedua metode tersebut hampir dapat dipastikan intensitas penggunaannya terbilang cukup tinggi, bahkan sangat tinggi. Baik di dalam negeri maupun di luar negeri. Pada penelitian ini, penulis mengkaji kecenderungan pemakaian metode penelitian pada jurnal internasional. Jurnal internasional ini diambil dari Education Resources Information Center (ERIC) sebagai media pencariannya. Setelah dicari, penulis mengambil dua sampel jurnal, yaitu; *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER) dan *Turkish Online Journal* (TOJ). Dari jurnal EU-JER ditemukan terdapat 30 jurnal. Dan dari jurnal TOJ, ditemukan 29 jurnal. Di bawah ini penulis jelaskan hasil penelitian.



Pembahasan

Publikasi dosen Indonesia pada jurnal internasional sangatlah beragam. Di antara kajian yang dijelaskan di bawah ini adalah kajian dosen Indonesia pada jurnal yang ada di Eropa, khususnya jurnal *European Journal of Educational Research*. Dari hasil penelitian yang sudah disajikan di atas, terdapat 30 publikasi pada *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER) melalui media pencarian *Education Resources Information Center* (ERIC) dengan kata kunci Islamic Education in Indonesia, maka intensitasnya dapat dijelaskan sebagaimana gambar di bawah ini:


Gambar 1.1. Intensitas Publikasi Dosen terkait Pendidikan


Berdasarkan gambar di atas, maka dapat dijelaskan bahwa dosen yang melakukan publikasi pada jurnal di atas dari mulai yang terbanyak sampai tersedikit, ternyata UNY dan UNNES menempati urutan pertama dan kedua. Masing-masing; UNY 8 (27%) dan UNY 5 (17%). Sisanya, seperti; UPI, UNM, Universitas Kristen Maranatha, UAD, dan UIN Yogyakarta masing-masing 2 publikasi. Sementara Sari Mulia University, Universitas Lampung, Universitas Jambi, Universitas Jember, IAIN Kudus, Sarjanawiyata Tamansiswa University, dan UIN Lampung masing-masing 1 publikasi. Dari hasil kajian ini, peneliti bertanya-tanya dalam hati yang terdalam, meskipun jurnal internasional dengan Q3 itu terdapat di Eropa, tetapi justru para penulisnya berasal dari dosen-dosen Indonesia. Mengenai, kenapa dan bagaimana hasilnya bisa menjadi demikian tidak menjadi fokus kajian pada penelitian ini. Dilihat dari status perguruan tinggi, Perguruan Tinggi Negeri (PTN) yang terbanyak melakukan publikasi di *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER). Sementara Perguruan Tinggi Swasta (PTS) sangat sedikit. Untuk lebih jelasnya, di bawah disajikan gambar.

Gambar 1.3. Tren Metode Penelitian Pendidikan



Berdasarkan gambar di atas, tren metode penelitian yang dipakai oleh dosen yang mempublikasikan hasil penelitian pada *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER) ,secara umum adalah kualitatif 50% dan 23% kuantitatif. Sementara untuk yang menggunakan metode eksperimen 14%, Mixed Method 7%, R&D 3%, dan Survei 3%. Untuk kenapa dan bagaimana data dari hasil penelitian bisa demikian, itu tidak menjadi fokus kajian penelitian ini. Semoga ke depan ada peneliti lain yang dapat mengkaji kenapa pada jurnal *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER) 50% menggunakan metode kualitatif.


Sedangkan pada jurnal Turkish Online Journal (TOJ) setelah dicari melalui media *Education Resources Information Center* (ERIC) dengan kata kunci Islamic Education in Indonesia, didapatkan pada jurnal TOJ sebanyak 29 jurnal. Dari 29 jurnal yang didapatkan pada TOJ, jika dirinci secara detail terdapat dua kategori umum, yaitu; penulis dalam negeri dan luar negeri. Penulis dalam negeri berasal dari; UT 10, UNM 2, Islamic Azad University, Iran 2, UIN Jakarta 1, UP Ganesha 1, Univ. Jambi 1IPGM Malaysia 1, The Islamia University of Bahawalpur, Pakistan 1, Kondoa Islamic Secondary School, Tanzania 1, University of Wollongong, Australia 1, Univ. Negeri Surabaya 1, Abu Dhabi University, UEA 1, IPB1, UMS 1, Universiti Brunei Darussalam, Brunei 1, UAD 1, University of Tehran 1, dan Univ. Gorontalo 1. Dalam hal penulis luar negeri lebih sedikit, dibandingkan dengan penulis dalam negeri Indonesia.

Berdasarkan gambar di atas, ternyata pada TOJ masih lebih banyak penulis dosen asal Indonesia, yaitu; 20 jurnal dengan persentase 69% dan penulis luar negeri sebanyak 9 jurnal dengan 31%. Sementara untuk pemakaian metode pada TOJ yang dapat dijelaskan melalui gambar di bawah ini.

Berdasarkan gambar di atas, trend pemakaian metode pada TOJ, terdiri dari; kuantitatif 14 jurnal atau sebanyak 48%, kualitatif 8 jurnal atau sebanyak 28%, survei 3 jurnal atau sebanyak 10%, mixed method 2 jurnal atau 7%, dan R&D 1 jurnal atau 4%, dan eksperimen 1 jurnal atau 3%. Maka, jika dibandingkan antara Turkish Online Journal (TOJ) dan *European Journal of Educational Research* (EU-JER), kedua-duanya bergerak saling berlawanan. Jika EU-JER 50% kualitatif, maka lain hal dengan TOJ. TOJ lebih kebalikan dari EU-JER yaitu 48% kuantitatif. Dilihat dari sudut pandangan asal peneliti, EU-JER 100% penulisnya berasal dari dosen Indonesia. Sedangkan pada TOJ terdapat 20 jurnal atau 69% berasal dari peneliti Indonesia dan penulis luar negeri sebanyak 9 jurnal atau 31%.

Kesimpulan

Berdasarkan hasil pembahasan di atas, penelitian ini dapat disimpulkan bahwa terdapat perbedaan signifikan dalam tren penggunaan metode penelitian antara European Journal of Educational Research (EU-JER) dan The Online Journal of New Horizons in Education (TOJ). Pada EU-JER, sebanyak 50% dari artikel yang diterbitkan menggunakan metode penelitian kualitatif, menunjukkan preferensi yang kuat terhadap pendekatan ini dalam mengeksplorasi fenomena pendidikan. Sebaliknya, pada TOJ, tren yang terlihat adalah dominasi penggunaan metode penelitian kuantitatif dengan persentase mencapai 48%, mengindikasikan kecenderungan untuk menganalisis data numerik dan statistik dalam studi pendidikan.

Selain itu, asal penulis artikel juga menunjukkan perbedaan yang mencolok antara kedua jurnal tersebut. Semua penulis pada artikel yang diterbitkan di EU-JER berasal dari Indonesia, yang menyoroti kontribusi signifikan peneliti Indonesia dalam jurnal ini dan mungkin mencerminkan fokus regional atau kerjasama akademik yang kuat di dalam negeri. Di sisi lain, TOJ menampilkan keragaman yang lebih besar dalam asal penulis, dengan 69% penulis berasal dari dalam negeri dan 31% dari luar negeri. Hal ini mencerminkan sifat jurnal yang lebih internasional dan inklusif, dengan kolaborasi lintas negara yang lebih menonjol. Pemahaman tentang preferensi metode penelitian dan asal penulis dapat membantu dalam merancang penelitian yang lebih relevan dan kompetitif, serta mendorong kolaborasi internasional yang lebih luas.

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
